TRADE IN YOUR TICKET

With the arrival of spring, the Trade in your ticket project has appeared in Parc-Extension. According to the project, **and on a specific operation**, when a pedestrian or cyclist does not obey the Highway Safety Code during a targeted operation, they have 7 days after receiving the ticket to make an appointment with the phone number on the back of the leaflet delivered by the police officer. The offender will then have to attend an information and prevention session on pedestrian or bicycle safety, as the case may be, to have their ticket cancelled. Trade in your ticket aims to improve the road safety record by targeting vulnerable clients who are frequently involved in collisions.

TIPS!

TO PREVENT JEWELLERY THEFT

- Travel in a group whenever possible
- Hide your valuable jewellery until you reach your destination
- Refuse a gift from a stranger and do not let that person come close to you

The thief (s) uses false pretences to get close to you (eg: asks for the way to the hospital or asks for the time). Then he offers you a piece of jewellery of no value, comes in closer to get you to try on the jewellery. At the same time, the thief steals your valuable jewellery without your knowledge. The theft is not noticed until later.


