NEIGHBOURHOOD POLICE STATION 33 IS MOVING HOWEVER THE POLICE OFFICERS OF PDQ 33 REMAIN ON DUTY IN THE AREA

On June 29th, the service counter of Neighbourhood Police Station 33 (570 Avenue Beaumont) closed. The non-renewal of the lease for the building that housed the PDQ 33 police officers is resulting in their temporary move to Operational Centre North.

The SPVM has chosen a building that already accommodates some of its other units. The space can temporarily accommodate PDQ 33's personnel until the Service de la gestion et de la planification immobilière of Ville de Montréal (SGPI) finds a building that meets its needs. The SGPI is already actively looking for a building.

In the meantime, the SPVM invites the public to visit its website or go to one of the reception counters near the neighbourhood.
