# WINTER | TIPS FOR COURTESY ON THE ROAD...





- Before turning at a green light, stop and yield passage to pedestrians crossing the road;
- Stop your vehicle before the intersection's stop line;
- Use your headlights at all times to see well and be seen by other road users.



- Make sure you are seen by drivers before crossing a street;
- Cross at the intersection or at the nearest pedestrian crossing;
- Respect pedestrian lights installed at intersections and, if there are none, follow the traffic lights;
- For more protection, remain on the sidewalk while waiting to cross;
- Wear clothing with bright colors or reflective bands to be more visible.

#### FRAUD | SPOOFING OF GOVERNMENT **TELEPHONE NUMBERS**

The SPVM wishes to inform the public that scammers are using telephone numbers from government departments, including those of the SPVM, to extort money from citizens. To trick people, they would use an application that allows them to display the phone number of their choice during a call.

Here are some prevention tips to follow when you receive such calls.

- Never disclose your personal information during a call.
- No police or government department ever requests the transfer of funds by cryptocurrency or the purchase of cards.

Anyone who may have been a victim of fraud is asked to go to their neighbourhood police station or to call 911 to file an official complaint.
