Hate Crimes

A hate crime is a criminal offence. To denounce it, call immediately **911**.

Here are some examples of hate crimes:

- To physically attack a person because of the colour of his or her skin.
- To make threats to a person because of his religion.
- Your home or other place of interest (ex.: place of worship), is vandalized by anti-semitic or other type of hate graffiti.

WHAT TO DO?

As a member of society, we stress the importance of reporting these types of acts in order to fight this type of crime.

If you are a victim of or witness to a hate crime, you can:

- Call 911
- Report the hate crime to the Police and provide the officers with all the information you can:
 - what the aggressor said, as well as any indication or information to confirm that this was a hate crime.
- Report an activity anonymously to Info-Crime Montréal at 514 393-1133.
- Contact the Crime victims' assistance centre (CAVAC) at 1 866 532-2822.
- Contact the Commission des droits de la personne et des droits de la jeunesse du Québec at 514 873-5146.
